#### What the Oil Industry Doesn't Want You to Know

Stephanie Smith July 2024 **TED-Ed** Talk Transcript "BIG OIL IS COMPLICIT IN A DECADES-LONG, MULTI-BILLION-DOLLAR, PR CAMPAIGN TO DISCREDIT CLIMATE SCIENCE."

In summer 1997, a full-page ad appeared in The New York Times. The message, from the Global Climate Coalition, issued a dire economic warning about the US embracing the Kyoto Protocol, a treaty to curb greenhouse gas emissions. But beneath the veneer of smiling children was something much more insidious: a multi-milliondollar campaign propped up by questionable data and backed by some of the world's most powerful companies. The Global Climate Coalition was itself a front for the oil industry -established to sow doubt and confusion about climate action.

But the real story starts decades earlier. In the 1970s, oil companies employed some of the world's top atmospheric scientists, as they needed to understand weather-related risks to their equipment and to assess the environmental impact of new projects. By the late 2 1970s, these scientists,

along with their counterparts in academia, had concluded that burning fossil fuels created a build-up of atmospheric carbon, which would impact the climate by trapping heat and increasing surface temperatures. They warned that an increase of even a few degrees could be catastrophic and accurately predicted events such as rapid Arctic warming and the melting of Antarctic ice sheets.

Throughout the 1980s, oil

industry reps met repeatedly to discuss these dangers, acknowledging the risk that their product posed to the future of humanity. However, instead of warning the public, or using this knowledge to pivot towards renewable energy sources, they doubled down on oil.

But in the late 1980s, scientists sounded the alarm about climate change, raising public awareness, and leading to calls for government action. In response, the oil industry (continued p.3)


